*******NOTE*******

Professor Frank Hawkins Underhill attested to the 4th Overseas Universities Co., CEF on September 29, 1915. His service number was 475345. He was a former resident of Toronto and was a History Professor at the University of Saskatchewan when he enlisted. He had been educated at the Universities of Toronto and Oxford, and was a key professor in the Khaki College of Canada, set up by the Canadian Army in England, to offer high school, technical and college courses to soldiers of the Canadian Expeditionary Force. In 1927, he joined the University of Toronto and was considered “one of the country’s earliest intellectual historians”. He was also considered a strident social critic and an ardent promoter of Socialist politics, co-founder of the League of Social Reconstruction and one of the architects of the Regina Manifesto (the founding of the C.C.F. and ultimately the New Democratic Party). Later he became involved with Carleton University in Ottawa, serving in it’s Senate and as a Professor of Political History, passing away in 1971.
